## **NON-DISCRIMINATION TITLE VI POSTER**

### **Title VI and Nondiscrimination Commitment (FHWA):**

Pursuant to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related laws and regulations, HOPEWELL CENTER will not exclude from participation in, deny the benefits of, or subject to discrimination anyone on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability.

### **Title VI and Nondiscrimination Commitment (FTA):**

### **Complaint Procedures:**

HOPEWELL CENTER has established a discrimination complaint procedure and will take prompt and reasonable action to investigate and eliminate discrimination when found. Any person who believes that he or she has been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI has a right to file a formal complaint with HOPEWELL CENTER. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with the HOPEWELL CENTER Title VI Coordinator within one hundred eighty (180) calendar days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence. ### **ADA/504 Statement:**

Pursuant to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504), the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) and related federal and state laws and regulations, HOPEWELL CENTER will make every effort to ensure that its facilities, programs, services, and activities are accessible to those with disabilities. HOPEWELL CENTER will provide reasonable accommodation to disabled individuals who wish to participate in public involvement events or who require special assistance to access HOPEWELL CENTER facilities, programs, services or activities.
